ADVANCES IN PRODUCTION MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS

Sustainable Production and Service Supply Chains

September 9-12 2013 the Advances in Production Management Systems (APMS) conference took place at Penn State University (USA). The conference is an annual event, and brings together leading experts from academia, research and industry worldwide. The production management community at SINTEF Industrial Management and the Department of Production and Quality Engineering (NTNU) has usually turned up at the APMS conferences in large numbers, and this year was no exception.


MONDAY

The conference activities began with a welcome reception at The Penn Stater Conference Center Hotel on Monday September 9. Here, the attendants of the conference were able to get acquainted with each other whilst enjoying refreshments in a casual environment.

TUESDAY

Tuesday September 10 was the first full day of sessions. Following three introductory plenary sessions, the SINTEF/NTNU community was actively involved in the first parallel session on ICT-enabled Integrated Operations. Dr. Daryl Powell (NTNU) was session chair together with Bernard Grabot from the National Engineering School of Tarbes (ENIT). Research fellow Harald Rødseth (NTNU) started with presenting the paper "ICT-Enabled Integrated Operations: Towards A Framework for the Integration of Manufacturing- and Maintenance Planning and Control" which was written together with Daryl Powell. Thereafter Børge Sjøbakk (SINTEF) presented the paper "Functional Requirements for a Collaborative Order Management Tool for Use in an Engineering Setting" which was written together with Ottar Bakås (SINTEF). Both Harald and Børge received multiple questions and positive feedback after their presentations.

Later the same day Sergio Cavalieri (University of Bergamo) presented the paper "Interactive Business Models to Deliver Product-Services to Global Markets" in the special session on Modeling of Business and Operational Process. The paper was written together with NTNU Professor Jan Ola Strandhagen, David Romero (Tecnológico de Monterrey, Mexico) and Paul Schönsleben (ETH Zurich).

THURSDAY
